Timothy Brownell, FGK, LLC T/a Sliders Bar & Grill, 504-06 Washington Boulevard – Class BD7 Beer, Wine & Liquor License – Violation of Rule 4.18 “No licensee shall commit or allow the commission on his premises of any act which shall be contrary to any federal, state or local statute, law or ordinance or against the public peace, safety, health, welfare, quiet or morals on August 12, 2009 and August 13, 2009 (Re: Establishment extended license beyond boundaries listed on Special Events permit which specified curb lane and sidewalk) and on August 21, 2009 (Re: Establishment extended outside service on a date for which there was no approval on a Special Events Permit or from the Liquor Board); Violation of Rule 3.02 “Licensees shall cooperate with representatives of the Board, members of the Police Department, Health Department, Building Engineer’s office, Grand Jury and representatives of other governmental agencies whenever any such persons are on official business” on August 13, 2009 (Re: Manager continued to exceed area identified in special events permit after warning on August 12, 2009) and on August 21, 2009 (Re: Manager failed to comply with Police Officer’s lawful order); Violation of Article 2B, Section 10-505 “Every person receiving a license under the provisions of this article

shall frame his license under glass and place the same so that it shall at all times be conspicuous and easily read in his place of business...” on August 21, 2009 (Re: License was not properly displayed); **Violation of Rule 3.03(a)** “Licensee shall keep accurate records of all purchases of alcoholic beverages for a period of one year from the date of each purchase. Such records shall include the date of each purchase, the quantity purchased, and the name and address of each seller. Such records shall be open for inspection at all times by duly authorized representatives of the Board” and **Violation of Rule 3.03(c)** “Licensees shall keep on their premises records containing the legal names, aliases, addresses, ages, and Social Security numbers of all persons employed by them. Such records shall be open for inspection at all times by duly authorized representatives of the Board, the Police Department of Baltimore City, and other governmental agencies” on August 21, 2009 (Re: No records available)
